The system is flexible, so you can include what you want without too much outside direction (beyond the 105 color pages, tabbed dividers with storage pockets, scrapbook cut-outs for decorating the pages and stationery for writing letters to the baby). The albums are covered in suede-like fabric in pink, blue or apricot, with a single Swarovski crystal adorning each design.

Face it: After the baby comes, filling in a book competes for your time with eating, sleeping and showering. So trust us, do it now.
